

## Commonwealth Citizens: Eligible nationalities

The following nationals can vote in all elections, providing that they also fulfil the age and residency requirements for such a registration, and are not subject to any other legal incapacity:

Citizens of the following countries can vote at all elections except UK parliamentary (general) elections. It is important to check whether these citizens have dual nationality with any countries listed above to ensure they do not lose their full voting rights.
