Review of Polling Districts and Polling Places

Notice is hereby given that the Council is commencing a review of the polling districts and polling places in its area. The Council has prepared draft proposals which are published on our website and available for inspection as set out below.

As part of the review, a public consultation will commence on Monday 19 August 2019 and will run for six weeks. The final date for receipt of representations is 4pm on Monday 30 September 2019. Any representations received will be published on the Rother website and will be available for inspection.

Any elector registered within the Rother district may make representations on the current arrangements and draft proposals. Representations are also welcomed from persons or group with interest or expertise in the access to premises or facilities for persons who have different forms of disability. Any person or body making a representation should, where appropriate, give alternative places that may be used as polling places.
